Diamond Teague was a 19-year-old African American youth from Southeast Washington, D.C. whose life was tragically cut short by gun violence in 2003. His story later inspired the creation of Diamond Teague Park, a waterfront park named in his honor.

Early Life and Community Work

- Diamond Teague was an active member of the Earth Conservation Corps, a nonprofit that helps young people restore the Anacostia River and develop leadership skills.

- Through this program, he worked on environmental restoration projects and community service initiatives.
- He had earned an AmeriCorps scholarship and was preparing to attend college, showing strong promise as a young community leader.
